
OKAVANGO DELTA WORLD HERITAGE SITE


1000th World Heritage Inscription

The Okavango Delta was inscribed on the World Heritage list of the convention concerning the protection of the world cultural and natural heritage on the 22/06/2014 in Doha, Qatar The Okavango Delta is a large low gradient alluvial fan or "Inland Delta" located in north western Botswana. The property encompasses an area of 2,023,590ha with a buffer zone of 2286,690ha The site has been inscribed based on the following Outstanding Universal Value. a) Exceptional beauty and aestheuc importance

b) Outstanding Ecological biodiversity and Hydrological Process
